our Lords One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety two Witnesseth
that Jacob Rapp of Chartstown Township Chester County and
State of Pennsylvania hath of his free and Voluntary will and
Consent of his Father Phillip Rapp of the Same Place ^{County}
aforesaid placed and bound himself Apprentice unto
Leonard Vanpiper of Norinton Township Montgomery ^{County}
aforesaid Cabinet Maker & Carpenter to Learn to Learn the
Said Trade Mystery or Occupation of Cabinet maker & Carpenter
which the Leonard Vanpiper now useth and with him as an
Apprentice to dwell Continue and Serve from the day of the date
hereof unto the full End and term of three years from thence Next
Ensuing and fully to be Compleat and Indeed during all which
term of three years Said Apprentice his Master well and faithfully
shall serve his Secrets keep his Lawful Command Gladly do
and Obeys heart to his Said Master he shall not do nor wilfully
Suffer to be done by others but of the Same to the utmost of his
Power shall forthwith give Notice to his Said Master the goods
of his Said Master he shall not Embezzle or waste nor them lend
without his Consent to any at Cards dice or any other unlawful
games he shall not Play Taverns or Ale Houses he shall not
frequent Fornication he shall not Commit Matrimony he
shall not Contract from the Service of his Said Master he shall
not at any time depart or Absent himself without his Masters
Leave but in all things as a good and faithful Apprentice shall &
will demean and behave himself towards his Said Master and all
his during the Said term and Said Master in the Said Trade
Mystery or Occupation of a Cabinet Maker & Carpenter which
he now useth with all things thereunto belonging shall and
will teach Instruct or Cause to be well and Sufficiently

taught and Instructed after the best way and manner he
can and shall and will also find and Allow unto his Said
Apprentice Meat drink washing mending and Lodging Every
day Cloathing and Necessaries fit and Convenient for such such on
Apprentice (Sundays Apparel only excepted) ^{during said term} and at the
Expiration of said term Said Master is to Give to Said Apprentice
one Sack plain one fore plain and a Smoothing plain
Witness whereof Each Partie have hereunto Interchangeably
Set their hands and Seals the day and date Above written
Signed Sealed & Delivered
